With all that work already done, we were open for business in a matter of minutes.

The first activity for the event is always the car cruise. Alan Finkenbinder and Dave Sullivan had done all of the prep work for another great cruise event. The cruise included a viewing of a Corvette and model train collection and also a lunch stop. While the weather in Pontiac turned rainy in the afternoon, the cruisers reported that the rain held off for them.

Of course, the main event is the big car show on Sunday. We arrived early and had registration up and running by about 8:30. The weather in Pontiac was dry, but weather reports for







the surrounding area had rain. Despite that folks started to roll in.

Traffic control was a bit different for this year with a lot of road construction and also renovations on the courthouse in the town square underway. Brian Sorensen and members of The Heart of Illinois GTO club took the lead performing the tabulation with some help from a number of Gateway GTO members. Once we had it all totaled up, Terry Schott helped get all of the trophies lined up, this year across the street from the court house due to the construction.

We then proceeded to hand out trophies for the Mayor's Choice, The Museum's Choice, and the Kid's Pick. This year Tim chose an original owner 1969 Trans Am as the Museum's choice. Gen 1 Trans Ams are exceptionally rare and to have such a nice example in the show along with its original owner was quire a treat.

Next up was awarding trophies for the 24 classes. Despite some less than ideal weather around Pontiac, we had a decent turn out of 114 cars for the show. With 72 trophies to hand out, a lot of those folks left with one.







Of course, all of this is to raise money to help support the Pontiac Oakland Museum. Once we totaled up everything, we determined that our final tally was \$3900 We will present a check to the Museum in a few weeks.
