



AUGUST 1991 GOAT OF THE MONTH "THE FEVER"

My affliction with GTO fever started in September of 1967. It's been quite a while ago, but I remember it like yesterday. I had just sold my '60 Chevy that I had gotten during by Senior year in high school and had my heart set on a '64 Chevy SS. Believe it or not, I was steered to my first GTO by my Dad. He had found it and seemed quite intent on me buying it. It was a Tyrol Blue 1967 Hardtop with a 4 speed and air. Remember, this is 1967 and I was only 18! No way could I afford such a dream car. This car had less than 5K miles on it and they wanted a whopping \$2,800. Sure, I knew about GTOs, but the bug hadn't bitten me yet. A test drive was all it took. I had to have it, and worked out the details. Nobody pays cash for them, do they? I was in heaven for the next year and a half - cruising, racing, etc. until somebody else decided they wanted it too. All the police recovered was the rear clip (I almost cried). Once that mess was settled, I ordered a new 1969 GTO and kept it until I entered the Navy and went overseas. End of story? Not on your life!

I happened to meet up with John Novelli early in 1988 (when he was a <u>nobody</u>) and saw one of his GTOs. That was it - the fever that lay dormant in me for all those years was

again active. I couldn't rest until I found another Goat. I wanted a '67 since I liked my first one so well.

I purchased my present GTO in May of 1988. A good friend of mine, who I grew up with back in Indiana, had recently acquired it and in a short amount of time I talked him out of it and sold my '81 Corvette. The car had just gone through a restoration with the correct factory red color. It did lack a detailing which became more of a minor restoration. The engine was pulled and it, along with the engine compartment, was painted and detailed. The 151K original mile car presently sports a fresh 455 with all the goodies, fitted with ported and polished '71 400 big-valve heads to run on pump gas. Carburetion is in the form of a ported '66 tri-power. The original 400 engine is in storage, all that is needed to make it a correct number matching car. Other options include power steering, power disc brakes, Rally gauges, Rally I wheels, tilt-wood wheel, reverb and a "rare courtesy lamp package". The tri-power, however not original, adds to the fun and excitement of the special group of fortunate people called "GTO owners". The car has won many trophies and is driven about anywhere or anytime the roads are decent, all year long. It has brought back a lot of memories for me and makes new ones at the same time. There's no other kind of car I'd rather have. Paul Middendorf's license plate, GTO FEVR, says it all. Thanks, Dad!




Darrell's 1967 GTO Hardtop at the Chesterfield Mail Car Show in 1989.

MINUTES OF JULY MEETING

WHERE HAVE YOU BEEN ALL MY LIFE, LITTLE GTO?

Have you ever wondered how your GTO started it's life and what it has been through during it's days on (or off) the streets? If so, there are two good ways to find out. The first is contacting Pontiac Historic Services to get the billing history card and other information pertaining to your car. (See Will Bower's article in the March issue of THE HOOD SCOOP for more information on PHS.) The other way is to run a Title History on your car by contacting the proper state government agency in the state or states in which your car has been registered. The agency will send you copies of all the information that they have on your car. This includes titles, title applications, affidavits, etc. These documents contain all kinds of information like the names and addresses of previous owners, sale prices, mileage and sometimes more detailed information on the status of the car at the time of sale.

I was amazed at the story of my 1967 GTO Convertible's life. From the information I received from the Title History and by contacting previous owners, I found out that I am at least the fourteenth owner of the car, it has been registered in three different states, and as far as I can tell, has not been on the street since 1973. And that's only a small part of the story!

To run a Title History in Missouri, send a letter to the Motor Vehicle Record Center, PO Box 100, Jefferson City, MO 65105. In the letter, request a Title History of your vehicle. Be sure to include the year, make and Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) of your car. Missouri charges \$4.00 per copy (the front and back of a title is considered one copy). Include a check for \$8.00 with your letter and they will bill you for the rest. Requests take three to four weeks. I have been told that Missouri has destroyed some records prior to 1968 if a car has transferred ownership since then. If you find that this is true for your vehicle after you receive the information, you should write another letter to the Motor Vehicle Bureau requesting the they look for more information on your car on their microfilm records. If you have any questions or want more information on Title Histories in Missouri, call the MVB Information Service at 751–4509.

In Illinois, send your Title History request to Secretary of State, Record Inquiry, Room 408, Centennial Building, Springfield, II 62756. Include the same information on your car that Missouri requires. Illinois only charges a flat fee of \$4.00, so include a check payable to Illinois Secretary of State with your request. For more information call (217)782-6992.

To get information on how to run a Title History in any other state, contact that state's Department of Motor Vehicles, Department of Revenue or Secretary of State.

The information received from doing a Title History on your can be very interesting and who knows, maybe you will find the person who still has the original motor sitting in his garage or basement!

WHAT'S NEW FOR GTOS

DENNIS KIRBAN: SPRING RING BATTERY CABLE SETS

Dennis Kirban has several new items available for detailing primarily under the hood. He will be doing the spring ring battery cable sets which have already been produced by another company. These are being done by the same supplier that does his dated Packard wire sets. There will be different cables supplied depending on the options on your car. Cars with power windows, convertible top, air or power seat use different cables from those without power options. The ends will show "P" and "N" and the correct part number where applicable. The other manufacturers sell their cables for about \$65.00; however, Kirban is offering the following special pricing through 7/31/91: 1 set - \$40, 2 sets - \$75, 3 sets - \$100. A substantial savings could be earned by combining orders.

DENNIS KIRBAN: GROUNDING STRAPS

Dennis is also offering 1964-72 grounding straps. These are the correct weave and length. The 1964-67 cars used a long thin strap which attached to the back of the passenger side of the engine head and to the fire wall and a shorter and wider strap which attached to the upper frame rail and the inner fender on the passenger side. The 1968-72 cars used the same long strap as the early cars and a longer strap for attaching the frame and inner fender. The price is \$12.95 per pair.

DENNIS KIRBAN: 1968-72 4 SPEED CLUTCH COUNTER SHAFTS

The 1968-72 4 speed clutch counter shaft has not been available from GM for some time. Kirban has located a good supply of these units and is offering them for \$48.95. These will really take the play out of your clutch linkage and if yours is worn, it could possibly save you a break down.

PETE SERIO: 1964 4 SPEED SHIFTER

Pete Serio has reproduced the complete 1964 4 speed shifter. Because these units were a one year item (don't have the Hurst name stamped on the shift handle), they have been more difficult to locate than some of the later shifters. He also offers a complete rebuilding service and shift linkage. Other units are planned for reproduction in the near future. 


