OCTOBER 1991 GOAT OF THE MONTH PURE HEAVEN

I got my Goat (no pun intended) back in the Spring of 1985. I had been in the market for a big-block 1970 Chevelle SS because a friend of mine had a beautiful Cranberry Red with black sport striped 1972 SS 402. During that time, my cousin told me that he was selling an old GTO that he had and said I should come over and take a look at it before I . made any hasty decisions about a Chevelle. When I got to his house and saw the car, it was another case of love at first sight. I must not have noticed the rust beginning to blister in the quarter panels and passenger side rocker panel, let alone the fact that the right quarter panel was caved in from the wheel opening back to the rear bumper. I contracted the body work out to professionals who fixed the dent and rust problems using patch panels and then resprayed the car in Starlight Black. The interior is all original (including carpet) and only needed to be removed and cleaned. The engine has been rebuilt to correct Ram Air III specs, but I utilized some of the old Royal Bobcat tricks such as recurving the distributor, bigger jets and thinner metering rods in the Quadrajet and lifters all set for zero lash using poly-locks. The transmission has just recently been gone through and built to within an inch of it's life. Short of being a full manual valve body, it still shifts plenty hard and works in conjunction with a 2500 Rpm stall converter.

In addition to the Ram Air engine and Turbo 400 transmission, the car has many other options such as Rally gauges with clock, a hood-mounted tach, custom-sport wood steering wheel, air-conditioning, power steering, power disc brakes, cordova top, full length center console and Safe-T-Track rear end with 3:55 to 1 gears. Rally II wheels without trim rings along with Redline tires give the car its nostalgic appearance.

The car has been pure heaven for me since day one. Turning low 14 second quarter mile E.T.'s with a relatively stock powertrain, it's quicker than almost any stock Chevelle. Now I'm glad I "got the Goat" instead!



OCTOBER 20TH: ANNUAL FALL COLOR/WINE RUN *






