
SEPTEMBER 1992 GOAT OF THE MONTH By Brian Ecker

All my life I've heard stories about GTOs. I'd hear stories at family get togethers about the Good Old Days when the thing to do was hang out at Steak & Shake or race on Hall Street. My father and his girlfriend have been very supportive with my GTO but he tells me stories about how my GTO will never be like it once was. Well Dad, I hope to restore it with the original 389 someday.

The car presently has a 1974 400 cubic inch Pontiac. It runs hard with the motor at stock bore and a Crane Blue Print Series RAIV cam and all new valvetrain parts (rockers, pushrods, lifters and rocker stud set). On top of the block, which has all new engine parts from HO Racing Specialties, are 1973 400 4X heads with 2.11/1.66 valves. The engine is connected to a recently rebuilt 1973 400 Turbo transmission with a shift kit and stock torque converter. The car is running with a 3.23 limited slip rear end with new differential, bearings and seals. Besides these facts, the car is all original. The present motor was installed at 55,717 miles and the car now has about 60,000 original miles.

This car has a bundle of new parts and up grades including urethane front suspension parts with new front springs, upper & lower bushings, link kits and front & rear shock mounts, all from HO Racing Specialties. Other new suspension parts are the sway bar and control arms. These items are followed closely by a completely new disc brake





system (new rotors, calipers, shoes, master cylinder, lines, wheel cylinders and original drums in the rear). Also new is the four core radiator, fan clutch, exhaust system, throttle cable, gas tank and Goodyear Eagle ST tires which are on 14X7 inch rims.

The body is all original with Silvermist Gray paint, black top, black upper instrument panel, black interior and chrome trim. The body has not been redone but needs touching up and the top needs a new zipper. The hood is a different color than the rest of the car because it has been replaced and the rest of the car was going to be repainted this color. The hood scoops and gas door panel and handle are also new.

Some items for the car that I have on order from Year One, Inc. are an antenna mounting pad, adapter and nut kit, vent window handles, trunk splatter paint, four new original style headlamps, door handles, rear door panels, convertible top with glass window and a hardware kit.

This should give you an idea of what the car is. It will have a lot more in the future considering work already done and things yet to be done. I bought the car from Steve Ward, a man who knows his Pontiacs, for \$5,500. It has been appraised at about \$6,600 considering that it doesn't have the original motor. This replacement value is based on the 1992 Old Cars Price Guide placing the car at #3 1/2 condition on a scale of 1 thru 6. I am looking forward to showing my car, doing things with the club and showing a few more Mustangs and small block Chevys what GTOs are all about.

ILLINOIS TITLE HISTORY SEARCHES UPDATE By Brad Piper

In a recent telephone conversation with Ms. Joyce Coffin, Supervisor of the Title Processing Division, Records of State, I learned that as of July 1, 1992, the State of Illinois is required by law to maintain title records for four (4) years <u>only</u>. Her office has, however, decided to keep records dating back seven (7) years.

You can no longer just send a \$4.00 check and your VIN, you must fill out a form (in triplicate!) to obtain the requested information. As of now, the only place to get this form (#VSD 375 - Information Request Form) is from her office, (217)782-6992. Once you obtain the form, complete it and return it with your \$4.00 check, there is a 10 day waiting period in which they check the current title and concur with the present owner (I know, it's my car, right?) to see if it's okay to release the information.

Now, for the problem - most GTO's haven't had a title change in the last 4-7 years, so the only chance you have is to include as much additional information as you can. Any previous title number will give them a lead to check or any old license plate number can also be traced. A copy of any previous title or other official document may help too. Be sure to include this or you'll receive a letter stating "...this office is unable to locate title information at this time." And that will be all you'll get from your phone call, postage & \$4.00 check! GOOD LUCK!


NOTICE TO ALL GGTOA MEMBERS:



Next was the awards presentation and fortunately, we did have a winner from the GGTOA. Cathey Pacelli took a 2nd place in the Modified Class with her 67 Hardtop. Congratulations, Cathey and Dave!

After such an eventful day, it was time to take a break. Those of us who were staying overnight in Indy went to the Speedway Motel to check in, unpack and freshen up. Then we all met at a Chi-Chi's restaurant for dinner. We said goodbye to Darrell, who headed home so he could attend a Boone Trait Corvette Club event in a borrowed Corvette on Sunday. (Is that dedication to the GGTOA or what?) After dinner we were off to Bill's Fabulous 50s Drive In for an evening cruise. Along the way, another GTO had trouble. Will Bower's 67 Hardtop backfired and wouldn't start again. While looking under the

hood, Will discovered that his distributor had turned 180 degrees. He turned it back and met us at the Drive In. We were the first GTOs there but by the end of the evening at least 15 to 20 had come and gone and at one point there was a row of seven GTOs on the lot, a very impressive sight! There were a lot of other nice cars there too and root beer floats were delivered by very talented roller skating car hops. By 11:30 PM we were all pretty tired from the long day so we headed back to the Speedway Motel for some much needed rest.

After coffee and donuts Sunday morning, we held an informal meeting to plan the trip home. We discussed ways to help avoid some of the car problems on future trips. Some one suggested bringing an empty trailer, but then a better idea was agreed on by all present. We should hauf a parts car along on any long road trips in the future. The next decision to be made was what year it should be and where to get it. Since most of the cars that go on our trips are 66 or 67s, it was decided that either of these years would do. Then it was suggested that Darrell Carnal should donate his 66 Convertible to be the designated parts car. All members present agreed.

Before we all loaded up to head home, Ron Fiebiger suggested to Will that he should borrow the distributor from Paul Middendorf's 66 Convertible since he wouldn't be driving it home. Everyone made it home and everyone did have a good time despite all that happened. I bet if you asked any of those that went if they would do it again next week (car permitting), they would say, YES! We all helped one another and that's what it's all about!


