GTO of the Month **My 1964 GTO** By Will Bowers





If it had not been for some bad weather, I might never have purchased my first GTO. The first Pontiac I owned was a 1962 Ventura with a 348 HP Tri-Power motor, 4 speed, 3:90 posi, and 8 lug wheels. It was a beautiful automobile and one that I was not considering selling until I got caught in a golf ball size hail storm. I took the insurance settlement and traded the Ventura to the local Pontiac dealer. On the show room floor were 2 new 1964 GTO's. A black hard top with red interior, 4 barrel, 4 speed and an Aqua GTO Sport Coupe with matching Aqua interior that was sitting on the dealer's floor. It had all the right stuff: Tri-Power, 4 speed, tach, 3:90 posi, handling package, splitters, read lines and 3 bar spinners. When in doubt always go for the Tri-Power. It was basically the same set up as the Ventura but much lighter and faster.

Fast forward to 1983, I was again bit by the muscle car bug and after watching the local paper for sometime I purchased a 1965 GTO. I really liked the '65 but the '64 was always my favorite.

In 1986 I spotted a '64 convertible in Hemmings that was advertised as having the original Tri-Power motor, 4 speed and being an almost rust free Florida Car. After several telephone conversations with the seller who had brought the car to Chicago, I bought an airplane ticket and headed North. It is funny how things are never quite the way they were described.

The car was advertised as being drivable with a newly rebuilt Tri-Power. The owner picked me up at the airport and drove me to his home in Park Ridge. During the drive he mentioned that the car had not actually been running for at least 2 year and that the carbs were off the car. He said not to worry as his buddy had rebuilt them and would meet us at his house.

It was the ugliest thing I had ever seen!! It had been painted burgundy and was chalked so bad that it almost looked like red primer. All the trim and bumpers had been removed; however, it was almost rust free and straight. It did have the correct 76 X motor and was a 4 speed. After going over the body with a magnet, his buddy arrived with the "rebuilt"



carbs". They were greasy and rusty, but he offered to rebuild them on the spot if we could get some hot water to boil them out. I told the owner to forget about it and take me back to the airport. I hated to say that because under the burgundy paint there were traces of the original Aqua paint, the same color as my original '64. He said

if I was really interested in the car, there was a complete Tri-Power '64 Catalina he had for sale and he would install the carbs. They appeared to be in fairly good shape, even had the original tags that were the correct numbers for the GTO, so we installed the on the Goat. We poured in some fresh gas, but it would not fire. After some further checking we determined the points were not opening. After adjusting the dwell it fired and we took it for a test drive. The battery light was on and apparently not charging so we replaced the voltage regulator which solved the problem. We continued the test drive and it actually was not running bad and not over heating.

After some serious negotiation, we agreed on a price and the sale was concluded about 9PM. Believe it or not, I drove the car home that night with the bumper and trim stuffed in the trunk and back seat. Amazingly, I arrived home without a problem about 3:30 AM!!

I played around with car over the winter and decided to have some paint and body work done in the Spring. Obviously, it went back to the original Aqua color. Over the next couple of years more work was done including originare build the motor going .030 over and adding a down.

'65 068 Tri-Power cam. I have continued to rebuild the 4 speed, front end and other components. I located and installed a correct '64 3:55 posi, upgraded the trim with NOS when possible and added options including wood wheel, tilt column and tissue dispenser.

I was never actually satisfied with the initial restoration and decided to do it again in 1996. It turned out beautifully as the pictures indicate. After completion, my wife Donna purchased the Hurst wheels a surprise birthday present!!

I have taken the car to several POCI and GTOAA National events entering it in the Popular Vote class. It has always done well winning several First Place awards. The car has been featured in three magazines and was featured on the cover of Paul Zazarine's Pontiac's Greatest Decade and was photographed and used as a model for Polar Lights plastic model of their 1964 GTO convertible. It took a couple years for the model to be produce but Polar Lights eventually sent me a case of the models.

It is almost the way I remember my original '64 except on nice days the top goes down.

In 1964, the GTO was inaugurated and I was 15 years old, and not old enough to drive, legally. Let's step back a year when I was only 14. My parents had a routine, where after dinner they would go downstairs and watch TV. While I was upstairs "doing my homework". I learned that if I was really quiet, and timed everything right, I could "borrow" the car for a while and go over to my friend's house. At the time our only car was a 1956 Pontiac, probably a Star Chief or Chieftain. To me it was a monster, with manual steering. On one particular adventure, when I had a deadline to get home before my Dad was going somewhere, I ran out of gas. Trying to get it started, with what little gas we could find in some gas cans, I ran the battery down. By the time we got the battery charged, some gas in the tank, and my friend home, I pulled into our driveway and a Police car was parked at my house, and another driving around the block. Nobody was happy to see that it was me, they still thought I was studying. Now back to 1964. Without any help from me, my parents bought a new Lemans. It was beige, had bucket seats, a powerglide automatic on the column, and to top it off, the OHV Slant Six. At least that's what I think they called it.

Now I had it made, when my Parents went somewhere in the Lemans, I could "borrow" the old car again. Things went pretty good with that scenario, till one night I was at a friend's house, and low and behold, the 1964 Lemans pulls up looking for me. It was really hard to hide the pink and gray '56, so I was busted again. I did however, have a couple of successful runs in the Lemans.

By this time I was 16 and got my driver's license. Now I could legally drive the cars. In 1965, they traded the old Pontiac for a '65 Lemans, pretty much the same high powered equipment, just different colors, and a console and shifter. Over the next few years, there were a few scrapes I wrecked the '64 and it was rebuilt. Then I totaled the '65 when I rear ended a Vette.

When the 1965 Lemans was bought, I found some literature, that if you sent in the card, they would mail you some GTO posters. Thus my introduction to The Great One. During the following years I knew a few people that had GTO's, but it was not like the people that stop at the car shows, and everyone they knew had one. Those posters came and went. But over the years, they were always in the back of my mind.

In the early '90's I had some health issues and finally in 1996, I had open heart surgery. All was well for about 4 years, and I started having problems again. After several procedures, Debbie, my wife, asked if there was one thing I could get, that I really wanted. Was this the beginning of my Bucket List? Those GTO posters showed up on my mind, and that was the beginning of the search for my GTO. And you know 'the rest of the story."



Annual Poker Run for 2014



ARE YOU FEELING LUCKY?

The Second Gateway GTO Poker Run is scheduled for Saturday, June 21, 2014. This year, there will be no charge for participation. Each car will receive a black hand and a red hand of cards to play. There will be 7 cards drawn at the 7 stops on the run. Participants will select the best 5 cards to make their hand. The Gateway GTO Club will fund \$100.00 for the best poker hand and \$50.00 for the second best hand.

At 1:00 PM, we will meet at the Confluence Tower, located on IL, Route 3, about 5 miles north of I-270. The tower is privately owned with 3 viewing platforms. The highest platform is 150 ft. It affords an outstanding view of the confluence of the Mississippi and Missouri rivers and surrounding wet-lands. It also has the best views of the beautiful oil refineries in Hartford, IL. Groups of 20 or more will receive a discounted rate of \$3.00 to take the tour. The regular tour price is \$4.00. This is the stop where you will receive your first card.

You will receive your second card at the Lovejoy monument, located in the historic Alton Cemetery. This monument is the Tombstone of Elijah P. Lovejoy. Surprisingly, this monument is reputed to be the tallest in Illinois.

The third card will be picked up at the Alton Museum of History and Art located in "Upper" Alton and is located on the former campus of the old Shurtleff College. The college now houses the SIUE Dental School. Here we will have an opportunity to learn about Elijah P. Lovejoy, a noted newspaper publisher and abolitionist, the Underground Railroad and Robert Wadlow, the tallest person on record. The cost is regularly \$5.00 per person. If we have 15 or more participants, we will receive a reduced rate of \$2.00. You will be able to walk across the street and have your picture taken with a life size status of Robert Wadlow.

The tour will travel back down to Broadway Avenue, past the historic Lincoln Douglas square where the last debate was held. Statues of the two statesmen are located to memorialize the debate. We will not be making a stop here.

You will receive your fourth card at the River View Park, located in the Historic Christian Hill District. This stop offers a beautiful overlook of the Mississippi River.

We will then travel up the "Great River Road", passing by the Legendary Piasas Bird depicted on the cliff at Piasa Park. The drawing depicts a part bird, reptile mammal that was reputed to be able to carry off grown warriors after developing a taste for human flesh. (Yum Yum). The earliest record of the drawing is contained in the diaries of Joliet and Marquette.

The fifth card will be drawn at the historic village of Elsah, IL. The architecture found in Elsah demonstrates 19th century styles, including Greek revival, Gothic Revival, Mansard, Italianate, Saltbox and Garbrel. Elsah is the home of Principia College, the only Christian Scientist College in the World. We will be able to see the college, since it is up a hill. We will be making a loop through the small town and stop at the exit in a parking lot.

We will receive the sixth card at the Loading Dock in Grafton. This iconic bar has been transformed numerous times over the last twenty years. It has no historical significance but is noted for their cold beer. Hopefully, we will be able to park our cars in their parking lot. If not, the Bowers will have beer and wine in their car to be shared with all when they pick up the card.

Continuing on the River Road, we will drive to the Lodge at Pere Marquette State Park. The Lodge houses a tasting room for the Mary Michelle Winery located in Carrolton, IL. Here we can sample the wine, draw the seventh card, compare our poker hands and toast the winners. They have a beautiful patio, where you can view the river. If you choose to stay around after the poker run, a family style dinner will be served for \$15.00 per person. It will consist of fried chicken, or a meat dish and several side dishes. After dinner feel free to stay for additional adult beverages or further explore the area on your own. We will need a count of those planning to eat at the Lodge.



NEW AGE GTO CONCOURS PROJECT

The GTO Association of America has initiated a project to create a set of photo records on the 2004 to 2006 GTO in anticipation of a time in the future when these cars will participate in the annual GTO Association of America Concours car show.

Gateway GTO has been chosen as the chapter to assemble these photo documentaries.

The project requires six **BONE STOCK** new age GTO's - One manual transmission and one automatic transmission car from each model year.

Ground Rules for Eligible Cars:

- Car must be bone stock with NO aftermarket parts or modifications. The only exceptions are batteries and tires.
- Factory parts, such as the sports appearance package and 18 inch wheels, are allowed.
- All parts the car was originally supplied with, such as the spoiler, must be installed. (Exception: Parts removed to install other factory parts such as the sports appearance package or 18" wheels.)

Once the cars are identified, a photo session will be scheduled.

If your car meets the requirements of the ground rules and you are interested in participating, please contact Chris Winslow.
