Even though the styling was not my favorite, I was impressed with its performance even though it had the corporate (Chevy) motor. Pontiac did however pickup the styling and performance in 2005 and 2006. At least the hood scoops and spoiler were back!

to purchasing one of the "new" GTO's. St. Louis had been experiencing several really hot summers and I thought it would be great to have a GTO with comfort, handling, performance six speeds and most of all, ice cold AC!

I was aware that Pontiac offered the SAP or Sport Appearance Package installed through its dealers and started looking for more information on the package. There was a brief mention in the basic GTO brochure for 2005. It is described as follows:

"The opposite of stealth: Sport Appear-

ance Package"

"With a car that makes 400 horsepower and has hood scoops standard, "accessories" takes on a special meaning. From the school of automotive design that brought ground effects to motor racing, the GTO Sport Appearance package includes a front fascia with a new lower valance and recessed grille insert, rocker extensions, a custom high spoiler, a rear facial extension, and a deep-sounding mufflers with dual/dual chrome exhaust outlets. In extending

I decided that if I were going to start looking for a new GTO, it had to be one with extra styling ques. In January of 2013, I found a silver 2005 with the full SAP package located in Louisville with just 38k miles. It was one of those few nice sunny days early in the year and Donna and I decided to make a road trip. I knew from discussions with the owner that he had made a few modification including a ripper shifter, ram air intake, dash mounted gage package, aluminum skid plate and heavy duty stabilizer bar between the strut towers. The owner had retained and included the original parts to put back to stock. After a little ne-

The package was discontinued by Pontiac in early 2006, making SAP parts very difficult to locate. (However, the recessed grille inserts are now being reproduced, due to their popularity, and are being added by owners to their standard GTO's).

gotiation on price we were ready for the trip home.

Because the SAP package was a rare option, information was hard to come by. I started my research by looking through back issues of the "Legend" until I found a Silver SAP GTO on the cover. It was owned by Vic Schreck, President of the SVGTO chapter. I contacted him and he was very helpful by providing additional information on the SAP package. I learned there was actually a small

(difficult to locate) separate brochure on the SAP package. Fortunately, I was able to locate one on EBay.

Vic Schreck had purchased the complete package from the dealer when he ordered his 2005 GTO. He said that individual pieces of the package could be purchased separately and that the complete package listed for about \$3,500! He also stated the exhaust system in the package is

Interestingly, Vic mentioned that, in 2005, there were major delays with the GTO deliveries from Australia and problems at the dock. As a result, t the SAP package arrived ahead of the car at the dealerships. He actually became so tired of waiting he had the dealer find another GTO that was already in the States.

Overall, I am very pleased with the car and have put about 6k miles on it without any issues. It is great for those club events during the hot St. Louis summers.

Fuel Rail Cover Modification By Chris Winslow

As many of you know, there have been a few of the new GTO's lost to engine fires. Many of us believe that the source of these fires is the failure of the fuel line that routes under the left hand fuel rail cover. On the 2004 GTO's specifically, and to a lesser extent the 2005 and 2006 cars, this line is a bit too long and



tends to ride against the fuel rail cover. Since one end of this line is fixed to the firewall and the other to the fuel rail, this line is constantly rubbing against the edge of the fuel rail cover as the engine shifts left and right during normal driving. Obviously, more aggressive driving causes even more relative motion and consequently more rubbing.

Over time, the interaction between the fuel rail cover and the fuel line can result in a cut forming in the fuel line. This can eventually lead the fuel line to fail causing gas to spray all over the inside of the engine compartment. GM apparently recognized this problem because for the 2005 model year, they shortened the fuel line and changed the opening where the fuel line enters the fuel rail cover to make it considerably larger. These two things helped a bit, but I would still recommend that those of you with 2005 and 2006 cars check your fuel lines for damage.

So the question is, what can one do about this? Some people have actually just removed the fuel rail covers altogether. I am not a big fan of that look myself, so I did not go that route. The other mod I have seen is the ever popular shade tree mechanic trick of taking a short length of hose, splitting it down the middle, and securing it in place in the area where chaffing is a concern to act as the sacrificial layer. While this option will work, it leaves the end of the hose sticking out past the fuel rail cover, which is something that I was not prepared to live with.

In my case, when I first heard about this problem, I inspected my car and found that it had the condition. I immediately took the car to the Pontiac dealer to get the line replaced under warranty. The dealer I went to was surprisingly difficult to deal with on this issue and only reluctantly agreed to change the hose. Once I had the new hose installed, I needed to figure out a way to prevent the problem from occurring again.

After giving it some thought, I came up with a solution. It is basically a modified ver-





sion of the split hose option. What I did was take a short section of hose and split it down the middle. Instead of installing it on the fuel line, however, I used silicone adhesive and glued it to the under side of the fuel rail cover. I was careful to position it such that the end of the hose is just shy of flush with the edge of the cover. The result is that there is no relative movement between the hose piece I installed on the fuel rail cover and the cover itself. Essentially I end up with rubber on rubber contact between the hose section and the fuel line.

The result can be seen in the photo below. When the cover is installed, the hose section glued onto the underside of the cover cannot be seen. This solution allows the hose to be fully protected, but in a way that is not visible once the cover is installed.
