#### **Gateway GTO Annual Pinball Tournament**

The 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Gateway GTO Pinball Wizard Tournament was the best ever! And, we had the largest turnout with 35 players.

It was a beautiful, sunny day, inside and out. Everyone arrived on time at noon. Upon entry, each player was issued a raffle ticket, with 2 to be drawn at the end of the day as attendance prizes. With the money I collected, I was able to pay for the rental of Atomic, the tournament prizes, a 'tip' for our host (James) who normally does not do a tournament when ATOMIC is rented for private parties. Since we have been going there for so many years, he makes an exception for us. They do have regular tournaments for ATOMIC that can be found on their website. NOTE: the more players, the more money collected, the more attendance prizes.

Even prior to the games starting, sweat was pouring profusely from all the players. This may have been due to my shouting out instructions after James had explained it all to everyone. (You know my explanations tend to get long.) Each game had 2 players. Each player played about 20 games each, so the pace was fast and furious. There were many disappointments and arguments as the 'themed' games progressed, mostly on the playfields and backglasses as in the machines themselves since there were games such as "007 James Bond" with lots of killings, shootings and action. #### **Soda Museum Tour**

On Saturday night, March 15 at 8:30 pm (yes, that's PM – bet you didn't think that we could stay up that late?), 25 members of our Club went to "The Soda Museum & Main Street Arcade", also known as, "The Museum of Soda History", in St. Charles. Two hours passed by fast since there was so much to see and do. We had the museum to ourselves as regular hours, open to the public, ended at 8:30 pm.

Tom, the owner, gave us a grand tour that lasted almost an hour and could have gone straight through to the next morning and past that. So much to see, so little time. There are 4 floors. When you walk into the building, you are on the street level floor and you are greeted with a Coca-Cola sign made out of concrete that is about 50 feet wide and 3 feet high.









This had to be brought into the museum by breaking it up into half a dozen pieces and then put back together. Just standing at that spot and looking all around, up and down, side to side, at so many items, it made me feel like I was in a factory plant that was actually working to produce soda and it's associated items.

At 9:00 pm, we started the tour that lasted 45 minutes. Tom was able to answer all the great questions and comments from us. He has been collecting for 45+ years. Since the museum was not big enough to house his entire collection, he also has a few storage facilities and numerous items at his home. He regularly exchanges items in the museum with the other storage buildings. It is impossible to list all that is in this building, so I'll just give you some highlights:

Soda cans, bottles, cups, serving trays, signs, transistor radios, wall clocks, playing cards, etc., etc., etc.. Thousands of these from various companies, and soda products, such as:

Coca-Cola, 7-up, Mellow Yello, Lucky Club Soda, A&W Root Beer, Hires Root Beer, Fanta, Sprite, Dr. Pepper, Mountain Dew, Crystal Pepsi, TAB, etc, etc, etc, etc...well, you get the point.

Did you know that Coca-Cola alone has some 3,500 different soda drinks in its international arsenal, including OK Soda, and Surge? Probably, most if not all, are represented in this building.

After viewing all the items on the 'main' floor, such as soda coolers and machines (mostly Coke), we went up to the two top floors. The lower one had a serving bar and tables with a 'looping' video on a tv that showed much of the museum that you probably didn't get to see on the tour. The top floor had many vintage collectables (so did all the other floors) and that was the grand finale of the tour itself. Model cars, trucks, delivery items such as wooden







and cardboard boxes that held bottles of soda that were delivered to homes as well as businesses. And, so many (mostly empty) bottles of so many soda brands both small and big, tiny and huge that were in glass enclosed cases as were on all the other floors. Almost nothing was for sale, except Tom mentioning that everything has its price, as we all know that saying.

The building was built in 1896. It was originally a flour mill, then became a hardware store (1896-1936). Next it was a JC Penney (1939-1979), after that Gene's Shoes (1979-2021). Then the museum in 2021.



Lastly was dinner. We went back down to the basement to have pizza which was included with the price of admission, while we played some vintage amusement games as well as pinball and skeeball. A good variety of food was available for purchase as well as over 100 unique bottles of sodas to purchase with your meal,





Tom was nice enough not to rush us out as our allotted time was running out. Many people said that they were impressed enough to want to return. After all, it's impossible to see everything in one visit...even two, maybe three?? Nah!
